

26. That on October 2, 2012, at approximately 6:00 p.m. Defendant Peebles ordered more followers to trespass on the church property. This time, two followers trespassed on the church property and were ordered to vacate by a Maryland National Capital Park-Planning Police Officer working security. Just as before, the October 2<sup>nd</sup> followers initially refused to follow the directions of the law enforcement officer, but eventually relented and exited the sanctuary.

27. That upon leaving the sanctuary, the first October 2<sup>nd</sup> followers waited in the church's parking lot until Defendant Peebles arrived with approximately twenty (20) more followers. Once Defendant Peebles arrived, he and all of his followers stormed back into the church. Again, the Park Police Officer informed Defendant Peebles and his followers that they were trespassing and ordered them to vacate the property. However, this time Defendant Peebles and his 20+ followers refused to leave and the Park Police Officer had to call for back up from the Prince George's County Police Department.

28. That within minutes several Prince George's County Police Officers arrived and began to order Defendant Peebles and his followers off the property. Then, at some point after the officer had begun to ask Defendant Peebles and his followers to leave the building, a supervising Lieutenant arrived and informed Deacon Jackson that "he had read the newspaper, he was familiar with the court decision, this was a civil matter and that he and his officers were not getting involved unless he had a sheet of paper instructing him to."
